### Michael Zaeh recommends...



**My most favorite place** | I often enjoy to visit the Olympic Tower and its viewing platform as well as the revolving restaurant or the Olympic Park.




**My most delicious restaurant** | I like Indian cuisine, especially in the restaurant Swagat at Prinzregentenplatz, Prinzregentenstraße at the corner of Possartstraße in the basement.

**My most cozy/scenic pub** | I can highly recommend the lobby of Leonardo Royal Hotel at Moosacherstraße, which was our planned conference venue.

**If I would have time for leisure** | One of the beautiful public swimming pools in Munich, e.g. the Olympic pool, the Dantebad, the Phoenix in Ottobrunn or the Cosimabad in Bogenhausen are my favorite leisure locations.

**If I take my time for culture** | My recommendation is to visit a classical music concert in the Philharmonie, Gasteig, an opera in the Bayerische Staatsoper in downtown Munich or one of the many good cinemas in Munich.

### 70 years of Munich | 2016–2021

**2016:** Nine people were killed and numerous injured in the attack at Munich's Olympic shopping center on 22<sup>nd</sup> July. A memorial has commemorated the victims since 2017.

**2019:** On 27<sup>th</sup> September, Munich Airport recorded more passengers than ever before on a single day, with more than 174,000. The week from 23<sup>rd</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> September is also the busiest week in the airport's history, with 1,115,500 passengers.

**What I show all my guests** | The Olympic Park, the English Garden, the Tegernsee, the salt mine in Berchtesgaden, the water power plant at Walchensee/Kochelsee or the city of Rothenburg ob der Tauber, a town almost in original shape preserved from the middle ages, are good places to visit as a tourist.

**Wolfram Volk recommends...**

**My most favorite place** | This is not easy to answer, because there are so many beautiful locations. If I have to decide, I recommend the area around Odeonsplatz with the Theatiner Church in the evening.

**My most delicious restaurant** | Without doubt this is the Weinhaus Neuner in Herzogspitalstraße in the city center – excellent food and wine within a unique atmosphere.



**My most cozy pub** | Based on 'older' times in Munich, I recommend the Alter Ofen in Zieblandstraße in the student district Maxvorstadt.

**If I would have time for leisure** | The beer garden tour through the English garden is a Munich classic. But be careful, if you drink one mass of beer at every place – there are at least five beer gardens 😊.

**If I take my time for culture** | I like to go to the Pinakotheken.

**What I show all my guests** | The Upper Bavarian lakes and the Alps with at least one of the king's castles (Linderhof, Herrenchiemsee, Neuschwanstein) are a must-see for everyone!

Bavarian vs. English**

Kaffä [kafä:] | coffee

Kuacha [kuächà / kuächñ] | cake

*Dallmayr on Marienplatz has the best coffee and cake. That's worth a trip!*

**Bavarian food | Bavarian cream**

300 ml milk, 1 vanilla pod(s), 5 sheets of gelatine (white), 4 egg yolks, 100 g sugar, 300 g cream

1. Whip the cream until stiff and place the gelatine, sheet by sheet, in cold water. Heat the milk with the pulp of the vanilla bean.
2. Whisk the egg yolks and sugar until the mixture is white and creamy.
3. Stir the milk into the egg mixture. Whisk over a water bath at low heat. Squeeze out the gelatin and gradually dissolve it in the cream while stirring.
4. To chill the cream, use a bowl with ice cubes. Keep stirring and wait until the mixture gels. Just before it gels, fold in the stiffly whipped cream.
5. Cover the cream and put it in the refrigerator for a few hours. To turn out, place the bowl briefly in warm water, then it is easier.

### 70 years of Munich | 2016–2021

**2020:** On 27<sup>th</sup> January, the Munich Clinic in district Schwabing admitted a patient infected with the novel Corona virus (SARS-CoV-2). It is the first patient in Germany with this diagnosis.

**2021:** Since the beginning of May, beer gardens and open-air pubs have been allowed to reopen in Munich. In the Bavarian capital, people talk about so-called "Schanigärten" – temporary terraces between parked cars that are allowed to remain permanently after the second Covid lockdown.
